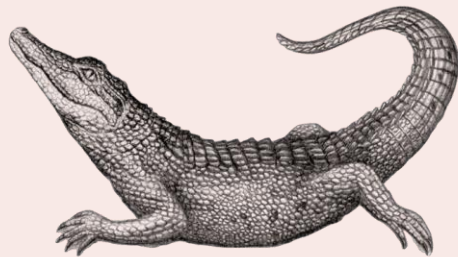


# EVENTS WINE LIST



# France

## Champagne

**N.v Charles Heidsieck – Brut Réserve (Chardonnay, Pinot Noir) £95**

The Brut Réserve NV is a radiant pale gold colour with fine, persistent bubbles. The nose is characterised by complex pastry aromas, with an opulent combination of ripe apricot, mango and greengages, dried fruits, pistachio, and almond.

**n.v Charles Heidsieck – Blanc de Blancs – Brut (Chardonnay) £125**

Charles Heidsieck Blanc de Blancs bears all the hallmarks of Charles Heidsieck Champagne: boldness, generosity and elegance. Embracing yet light, it displays appealing mineral, slightly salty, iodine notes, and has a silky, creamy texture

**n.v Billecart-Salmon – Brut Sous Bois – Brut (Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Pinot Meunier) £130**

Made from grapes sourced from Premier and Grand Cru Chardonnay from the Côte des Blancs; Premier and Grand Cru Pinot Noir from the Montagne de Reims, Ay and Mareuil-sur-Ay; and Pinot Meunier from the right bank of the Vallée de la Marne. Fermentation takes place entirely in oak barrels.

**2008 Rare – Millésime – Brut (Chardonnay, Pinot Noir) £225**

A subtle, mineral 2008-vintage Rare Champagne from Piper-Heidsieck, made with 70% Chardonnay and 30% Pinot Noir grapes. Aromas of spring flowers, tangerine, lychee, elderberry, sweet almond, and dark berries fill the nose. The palate offers notes of dark fruits, citrus, star anise, violets, smoke, and vanilla, alongside a subtle minerality

### Champagne Rosé

**n.v Paul Bara – Grand Rosé de Bouzy (Chardonnay, Pinot Noir) £115**

The Grand Rose from the iconic cellar of Paul Bara is a study in elegance. This multi-vintage blend is comprised of 70% Pinot Noir, 18% Chardonnay, and 12% Bouzy rouge - a still red wine made from Pinot Noir. The Grand Cru region of Bouzy is famous for its outstanding Pinot Noir.

**n.v Billecart-Salmon – Brut Rosé (Chardonnay, Pinot Noir) £145**

Pale yet intensely pink in colour, the Billecart-Salmon Brut Rose is pure, fresh, and intense on the nose, with lovely raspberry aromas, refreshing citrus zest flavours and amazing definition.

# White

- 2021 Fiano - Ciaca Bianca - Mandrarossa - Sicily, Italy (Fiano) MED - LIGHT BODY £45**  
This wine is straw yellow in colour with green hues. On the nose, it has fresh and fragrant aromas of jasmine, basil and grapefruit, tomato leaf and laurel. The palate is fresh and mineral, with hints of aromatic herbs such as oregano and mint, and excellent length.
- 2020 Rueda - Verdejo - Javier Sanz - Castilla y León, Spain (Verdejo) MEDIUM BODY £50**  
A refreshing Verdejo with delicate aromas of citrus fruits, ripe pear and aromatic herbal notes combined with a hint of mineral complexity. Tangy and refreshing, with a pure, persistent finish of juicy pear and delightful gooseberry notes.
- 2021 Gavi di Gavi - La Giustiniana - Lugarara - Piedmont, Italy (Cortese) LIGHT BODY £65**  
A mineral and flinty wine with white peach fruit, key lime and lime rind, yellow apple, papaya and herbal notes of sage and thyme. Creamy texture. The vineyards are farmed organic.
- 2020 Albariño - O Rosal - Terras Gauda - Rias Baixas, Galicia (Albariño) MEDIUM BODY £70**  
A refreshing Verdejo with delicate aromas of citrus fruits, ripe pear and aromatic herbal notes combined with a hint of mineral complexity. Tangy and refreshing, with a pure, persistent finish of juicy pear and delightful gooseberry notes.
- 2020 Sancerre - l'indiscrete - Domaine Girard - Loire Valley, FR (Sauvignon Blanc) MEDIUM BODY £85**  
Pale lemon, yellow in colour. The nose is fresh with lively citrus fruit notes and grass. The firm, mineral palate has an excellent balance of fine acidity with intense lemon, flint and pear flavours and a long crisp finish. It is medium to full-bodied.
- 2018 Riesling - Beblenheim - Domaine Trapet - Alsace, France (Riesling) AROMATIC (biodynamic) £99**  
This wine is all about finesse and elegance. They are characterised by purity, solidity, minerality, density like a diamond, viscosity, verticality, and everything is wrapped by delicacy and softness.
- 2020 Chardonnay - Tyler Winery - Santa Barbara County (Chardonnay) MED/FULL BODY £110**  
Justin Willett of Tyler is one of the most exciting winemakers in the world right now, and his reputation continues to grow from its in-the-know, word-of-mouth status; his wines receive stellar write-ups and scores. Notes of mineral flint and white chalk, with a combination of stone and citrus fruits and a hint of florality. On the palate, the wine is extremely mineral driven with white pepper and green apples.
- 2019 Meursault - Limozin - Domaine Monnier - Burgundy, France (Chardonnay) FULL BODY £125**  
Domaine Rene Monnier is a leading and sought-after producer situated in the heart of Meursault. With over 18 hectares of vineyard in the most prestigious Crus of the Côte de Beaune. The wine was 100% fermented in French oak, of which 30% was new

# Red

- 2019 Coume des Loups - Mudigliza - Roussillon, France (Syrah, Grenache) MEDIUM BODY £45**  
Coume des Loups is a new project from Dimitri Mudigliza, this Blend of Syrah and Grenache delivers a supple and velvety medium bodied red. A smooth red with hints of wild herbs and forest fruits. Rich and gamey with an earthy quality true to its origins in the Languedoc.
- 2019 Corbières - Château Fontarèche - Roussillon, France (Carignan/Syrah) MEDIUM BODY £50**  
This wine reveals fragrant aromas of black fruits with a hint of fresh herbs. The pure blackberry fruit character lingers on the vibrant palate, balanced by supple tannins.
- 2021 Dolcetto d'Alba - G.D. Vajra - Piedmont, Italy (Dolcetto) MEDIUM BODY £65**  
Vajra's Dolcetto comes from grapes in the Barolo commune as well as from nearby Novello, still in the Barolo DOCG. Vinified and aged in stainless steel to retain the exuberant fresh fruit.
- 2018 Saint-Romain - D. Taupenot-Merme -- Burgundy, France (Pinot Noir) LIGHT BODY £85**  
Cherries and red currants on the nose which turn to smoke and marinated fruits. Very structured, this wine has a beautiful, elegant body, retains a freshness and elegant soft tannins.
- 2018 Ribera del Duero - 2 Maderas - Valduero - Castilla León, Spain (Tempranillo) FULL BODY £90**  
Tempranillo grapes used for Valduero Crianza 2 Maderas come from old vines 30 years old, located at an altitude of 829m. The vineyards are planted in poor, dry soils with a clayey-calcareous character. Nice balance of fruit, and oak, round and velvety texture with a great texture and body. Simply delicious!
- 2018 Pauillac -- Tour Pibran - Bordeaux, France (Cab. Sav and Merlot) FULL BODY £90**  
Tour Pibran is the second wine of this famous Bordeaux state. A blend of Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon, with 18 months ageing in French barrique. The supple and harmonious attack, leads into, fleshy generous tautness. This wine shows balance and power, without abandoning the powerful Pauillac style.
- 2020 Pinot Noir - Tyler - Sta. Rita Hills, Santa Barbara County, USA (Pinot Noir) MEDIUM BODY £105**  
This wine is a fantastic introduction to modern Californian pinot noir. The grapes come from the highly rated, cold climate Sta Rita Hills region which gives superb freshness and lifted aromatics. On the nose the wine is both spicy and floral, this wine shows lovely black cherry fruit, a natural florality with dried herbs and bright red fruits. On the palate, the wine is restrained (not super ripe) and well-structured with notes of tart cherries, raspberries, undertones of warm spices and dried violets with lingering hints of salinity around the finish.
- 2018 Barolo - Mauro Molino - Piedmont, Italy (Nebbiolo) FULL BODY £130**  
This Barolo is Molino's is a perfect representative of one of the greatest native Italian grape varieties, Nebbiolo. An intense bouquet with hints of ripe fruit and rose petals. Persistent in taste, thanks to its fine and enveloping tannins that give an elegant pleasantness to this wine. Maceration in contact with the grape skins for a duration of 12 days, alcoholic and malolactic fermentation in steel tanks, aged in French oak barrels for 18 months.

## Rosé

Château Minuty is the story of the Matton-Farnet family for over 85 years on the Saint-Tropez peninsula.

Gabriel Farnet, who already owned Domaine de Châteauneuf in Vidauban, acquired Château Minuty in 1936. The estate was originally built under Napoleon III, as was the small chapel that gave its name to the cuvée de l'Oratoire, which remained the emblematic bottle for a long time. Many palaces on the Côte d'Azur still have these bulging bottles.

In 1955, Château Minuty was one of the 23 properties to be distinguished as a classified growth of the Côtes de Provence.

Château Minuty sees the fourth generation of the Matton family flourish in 2022 as Anne-Victoire Matton joins her father Jean-Etienne and Uncle François in the running of this Provençal gem.

**2021 "M" Minuty - Château Minuty - Côtes-de-Provence, France (Grenache, Cinsault) Light BODY £45**

A splendid, pleasurable wine. The Grenache and Cinsault blend form an aromatic harmony offering notes of peach and candied orange. The flavour is crisp and round on the palate.

**2021 Prestige - Château Minuty - Côtes-de-Provence, France (Grenache, Cinsault) Med BODY £65**

Precise and delicate with notes of flowers and melon.

Palate: Powerful and well balanced with hints of citrus and red fruit, highlighted by a pleasant minerality.

**2021 Rosé et Or - Château Minuty - Côtes-de-Provence, France (Grenache blend) Med/ Full BODY £80**

Rosé et Or is made from 95% Grenache and 5% Syrah, cool-fermented to create an elegant yet vibrant and aromatic rosé with superb freshness.

**2021 "281" - Château Minuty - Côtes-de-Provence, France (Grenache, Cinsault) Med/ Full BODY £165**

Château Minuty 281 is an exceptional cuvée, a true concentrate of Provence, made from a selection of Grenache clones that are an average of 25 years old and cradled by the maritime influences of the Château Minuty terroir.

Jean-Etienne and François's father. He began cloning the winery's exclusive Grenache in the 70s which now forms the 281 vintage's best plots. So, the 281 is a rosé for celebration, haute-couture and fine dining.

# Orange

Turns out, orange wines might've been how all wines looked like in the past. Centuries ago, red, and white grapes were simply crushed together and left in vessels, usually oversized clay jars called amphora - to ferment and turn into wine. The wines would not have been filtered necessarily, leaving a cloudy, characterful wine of an orange-ish hue.

I don't think anything could have prepared me for the moment I had a glass of orange wine for the first time. It didn't smell of berries or apples. It took me a proper minute before I started picking out aromas that I recognised marinated green olives, pickled quince, olive oil drenched anchovies and chamomile tea.

I hate chamomile tea, but I was hooked on this wine.

This is exactly what orange wines are. They are made with white grapes but with an extended time spent macerating on their skins. The pigmentation in the white grape skins lend the wines their amber hue. Modern winemaking has surely provided the quality infrastructure in which these wines can be made well, consistently.

**2019 VDF - Vin Orange - Bricka - Savoie, France (Chasselas) MEDIUM BODY (Vegan, Organic) £75**

Bricka worked with a local organic grower near Geneva, to produce this fresh and aromatic Orange wine. Made entirely from Chasselas, a grape native to the Savoie region, it rests on skins for up to 12 days to produce its distinctive colour. This is a wonderful bottle to open you up to the world of Orange wine. Light and fragrant, with notes of bergamot and clementine.

**2020 Colline Lucchesi - Palistorti - Tenuta di Valgiano -Tuscany, Italy (Vermentino blend) MEDIUM £90**

Palistorti di Valgiano, a singular white blend of 50% Vermentino, and equal parts Trebbiano, Malvasia, and Grechetto. The grapes are pressed and left on their skins for anywhere between a few hours and a few days, soaking up the rich phenolics, adding aromatic extract and a bit of texture. The juice is fermented in mostly stainless steel, with about 10% of the Vermentino reserved for ageing in oak barrels. The result of all this laborious, mindful work is an exotically aromatic, layered white wine that has the perfumed contours of Malvasia, the brisk salinity of Trebbiano, and the savoury texture of Vermentino.

## Sweet and Luscious

**2016 Maury – Mudigliza – Dimitri Glipa – Languedoc-Roussillon, France (Grenache) (75 cl) £65**

Very rich sweet fortified red wine with prune, mocha, caramel and herb flavours. Vegan. An exceptional partner to chocolate, foie gras and strong cheeses, particularly blue cheeses.

**2018 Bianco Veneto Passito – I Capitelli – Veneto, Italy (Garganega) (37.5 cl) £60**

Located in one of the most beautiful wine areas in the province of Verona, historically suited for viticulture. This Passito, as Soave, is characterised by its features and original organoleptic profile; it is a white wine, raisin and sweet, vinified from Garganega grapes. The wines of the Anselmi winery and in particular I Capitelli, are characterised by the right sugar and alcohol content and good fixed acidity, which contributes to enhancing their aromas and keeping them over time.

**2019 Ariyanas Dulce – Bodegas Bentomiz – Málaga, Spain (Moscatel) (50 cl) £75**

The vineyards are located in the Axarquía region of Malaga. Some of the vines are 80-100 years-old and were planted pre-phylloxera. The soils are slate, and the altitude is between 400-800 metres. The altitude, combined with the Mediterranean climate, sea breezes and significant diurnal temperature range gives the fruit the freshness necessary to make very balanced wines.

Grapes are dried on mats for between 5-7 days, with regular turning, after which they are taken to a pneumatic press. Once the must has been extracted, the wine is fermented in stainless steel tanks. Because of the concentration of the wine, 4 kilos of grapes are needed to make one litre of wine.

**2012 Sauternes, Castelnau, Château Suduiraut, France (Semillon / Sauvignon Blanc) (75 cl) £95**

Castelnau de Suduiraut is the second wine of Château de Suduiraut, Cru Classé Sauternes Estate. This superb value for money dessert wine is elegantly rich and voluptuous with almonds, honey and sweet candied fruits.

In a prime location bordering the uber-producer of Sauternes, Château d'Yquem, Château Suduiraut farms 90 hectares of vineyards planted to 80% Semillon and 20% Sauvignon Blanc, and is known for sweet wines of profound depth, balance and complexity. Farming sees the fruit harvested in tranches for selecting fruit, before the wines are fermented in stainless steel tanks - the wines mature in 33% new oak barrels for up to 24 months.

**2019 Passito di Pantelleria, Ben Ryé, Donnafugata, Sicily, Italy (Zibibbo) (37.5 cl) £105**

Ben Ryé is the luscious “passito” sweet wine from the little island of Pantelleria where old Zibibbo vines are grown using the traditional “alberello pantesco” bush-training system. Dried grapes give the intense honey, apricots and almond finish
